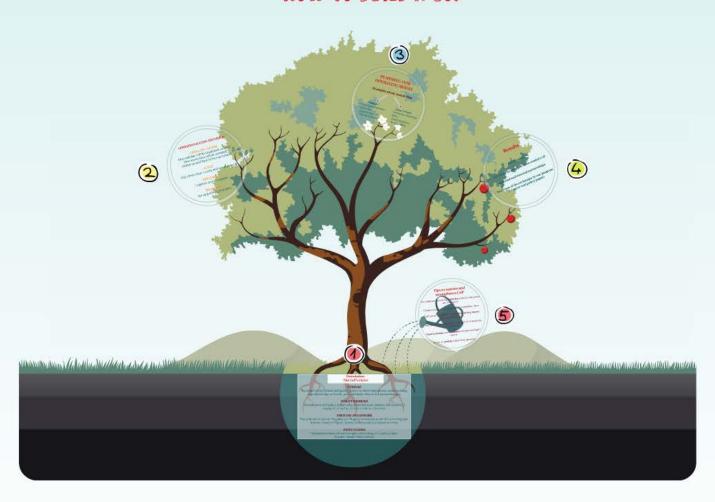
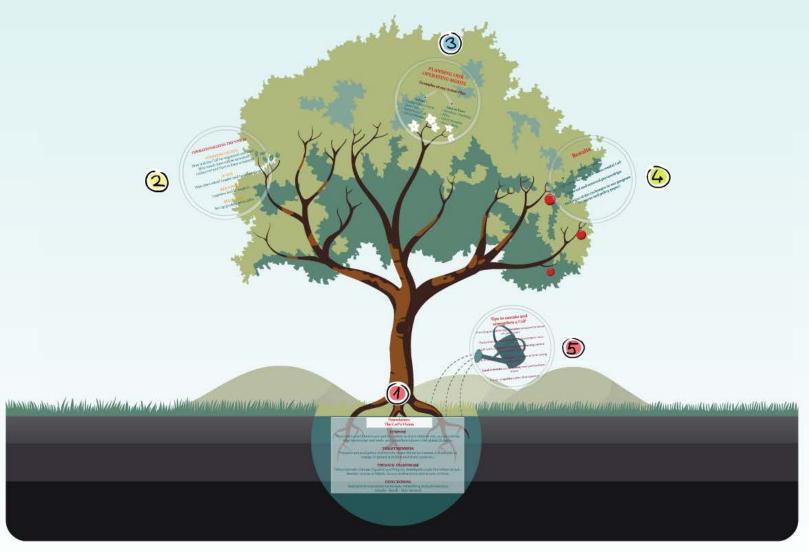
HOW TO BUILD A GOP

Tips to sustain and strengthen a CoP

Providing and receiving attention enhance the sense of community

Understand group dynamics and members' roles

CoP needs a regular meeting rhythm (e.g. once a month, twice a year)

Clear **lines of responsibility**: you gain in time saving + efficiency

Good activities can stimulate new partnerships/ teams

Focus on quality rather than quantity



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
